SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED

Bethlehem administers two scholarship programs that are open to active congregational members. Applications are accepted in the Spring and reviewed by the Mission Endowment Committee. The committee then forwards its recommendations to the Church Council for formal approval.

The MISSION ENDOWMENT SCHOLARSHIP is a one-time, non-renewable award that is funded by investment income through Bethlehem's generated Mission Endowment Fund. Applicants must be students at accredited post-secondary educational institution such as a two-or four-year college, a vocational school, or an on-line program. This year we are pleased to extend \$1,000 scholarships to each of the following: Kamryn Johnson **Superior** (Lake College, Duluth. **Amery** (University MN); Oberg Wisconsin-Superior); and Ryan Shannon (Bethel University, St. Paul, MN)

BETHLEHEM LUTHERAN'S CONCORDIA COLLEGE CONGREGATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP is funded by a donation from an anonymous Concordia College alumni. Applicants must attend Concordia College in Moorhead, MN.

The \$1,000 scholarship is matched by the college up to \$500 per year and is renewable for a total of four years. This scholarship was awarded last year to **Rowan Lindholm**. This year we are pleased to renew it for a second year, as Rowan will be returning to Concordia as a sophomore in the Fall.

Congratulations to these four students, to the entire CCHS Class of 2024, and to all other Bethlehem members who are pursuing their education in some manner. We are proud of you all!

The Reconciling in Christ Committee is back at it! We tabled our discussions when Pastor Mark retired and are ready to re-open this conversation. This is the Statement of Intent that we wrote a couple of years ago:

The Reconciling in Christ Committee at Bethlehem Lutheran Church intends to:

- 1. Explore and develop, along with the larger church body, a welcoming statement, that specifically includes and lists people who have experienced oppression from the Christian church. People who have experienced oppression due to racial and social inequities, gender and gender orientation, and other types of oppression, need to know where they are safe.
- 2. Invite all people, which includes all races, ethnicities, genders and orientations, to fully participate in leadership positions, ministry, fellowship, worship, sacraments, responsibilities, blessings and joys of our church community.
- 3. Encourage usage of spaces within the church building that support the needs of all people, and encourage discussion of physical changes to the church building to create a more welcoming space to all people.
- 4. Encourage annual meaningful contributions to local organizations and other synodical organizations, which support all people.

We are once again looking at bringing up speakers and hosting workshops to explore these topics through conversation. Stay tuned for future updates!




Wilderness Canoe Base Work Day May 18, 2024 8:00 am - 4:00 pm

A brief overview of the day: (This might change!)

Wilderness Canoe Base is located on Dominion and Fishhook Islands at the very end of the Gunflint Trail. There are no paved trails and there are some hills to climb. Outhouses and flush toilets. It takes a good hour to drive there. We will meet at church and be on our way by 8:00 am. You get to the islands by pontoon, across Seagull Lake. They have life jackets that fit children older than six. Bring your own for younger kids.

The work:

We will be working with staff for a couple of hours in the morning and also some time in the afternoon. Projects have not completely been determined but might involve such things as carrying firewood, fixing things, and getting the camp ready for the change of seasons. Some projects will be indoors and others will be outdoors.

Food:

Lunch is provided as we are doing "God's work. Our hands." Projects. Please fill in dietary needs as staff will work to meet dietary needs, as possible. **Sign up by**

Care for Creation:

We will end our time together in the outdoor chapel. A tour of the camp may be available, time dependent.

What to do:

- We need a good estimate by May 5th of how many people are coming, and a solid count by May 12th so the staff can plan for our lunch
- Please complete your phone and email so that we can reach you with updates.
- Check the box if you are willing to drive, and fill in how many passengers you could take.
- Here is a list of what to bring: day pack, hat, mittens/warm gloves, bug spray, sunscreen, rain jacket, water bottle, long pants, sturdy shoes/boots, work gloves, and a life jacket if your child is under 6-years old.

FREE TREE SEEDLINGS



Again this year Carolyn Dry, "The Tree Lady" and associate member, has purchased 5100 trees and seedlings to spread around Cook County. Carolyn has made it her personal "Do Gooder" project to aid in reforestation. For the last few years she has distributed native trees and shrubs to Cook County. She has provided thousands of apple trees to over 90 state prisons for orchards.

Last year she was unable to be here for the distribution and Bethlehem stepped in to help. To the rescue, Lyle and Laurie Spry jumped in and coordinated the give away. Again this year the Spry's and Dry will coordinate the distribution but they could use some help.

At the time of this writing we are <u>hoping</u> that the delivery will be made for distribution on **Saturday May 4th beginning at 9:00 am.** Helpers should be at Bethlehem by 8:30 am. Seedlings, mostly native, will be distributed in the alley. Seedling types available are: Tamarack, Wild Plum, Butternut Hickory, Red Oak, Black Cherry, Elderberry and Maple.

Listen to WTIP Radio Station (90.7 FM in Grand Marais; 89.7 FM on the Gunflint Trail) **for confirmation of the distribution date**. Delivery of trees is weather dependent. Please bring your own buckets to transfer your seedlings.


