

Gratitude makes the difference

Most nights before bed, I write in a gratitude journal a few things from my day that made me smile, that I'm proud of or that brought me a sense of peace. Journaling trains me to focus on lifegiving, joyful moments and not lose track of these when I'm struggling or feeling overwhelmed. Something about physically keeping track of joys helps me remember them and look for more of them the next day.

Cultivating gratitude helps me take more notice of what I focus on. Even if it is just that a particularly hard day is over, goodness exists. Naming this goodness helps it to become more real and present. I think of Scripture, where the author of Lamentations writes:

"The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness"

(Lamentations 3:22-23).

When I write down the goodness I see, I tend to see goodness more easily.

WINTER PARKING ORDINANCE CHANGES

WINTER IS HERE, AND SO ARE THE NEW PARKING RULES TO KEEP OUR STREETS CLEAR AND SAFE! HERE'S WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW TO AVOID GETTING SNOWED IN OR TOWED:

NEW HOURS FOR OVERNIGHT PARKING:

Remember, parking on Highway 61 is now prohibited from 2 AM to 7 AM. Give those plows room to work their magic!

CALENDAR PARKING IN EFFECT:

Starting November 15 at 12:01 a.m. through April 15 at midnight, follow this rule daily:

- <u>Odd days:</u> Park on the side with odd-numbered addresses
- Even days: Park on the side with even-numbered addresses

ADDITIONAL RESTRICTIONS:

Some areas will be off-limits for parking all winter long.
